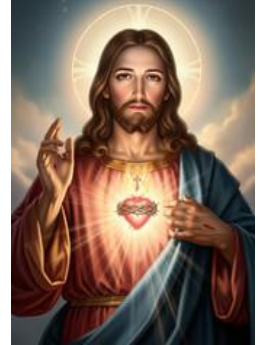

I am looking forward to a great attendance at our monthly meeting so everyone can stay informed as to what is happening each month in our council. Come to meetings and be informed.

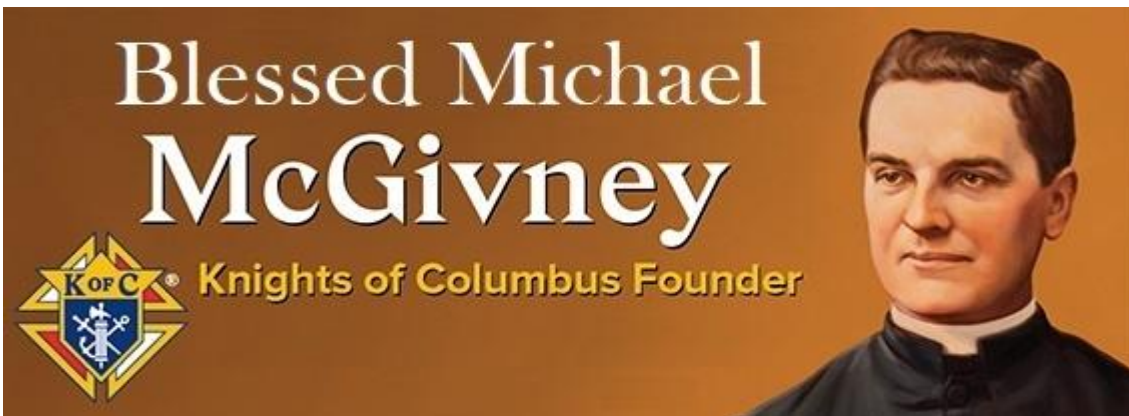

Chaplain's Message



Dear Brother Knights,

On August 13, the Church celebrates the memorial of Blessed Michael McGivney, the founder of the Knights of Columbus. It is a fitting opportunity not only to remember his life, but also to ask ourselves a simple question: ***What made***

Father McGivney the man he was?

We often think first about what he accomplished. He founded the Knights of Columbus, and through his vision millions of Catholic men have been united in faith and charity. But before he was a founder, he was a priest—a man who belonged to Jesus.

Everything else flowed from that.

When Father McGivney looked at the struggles of the families entrusted to his care, he did not begin with a grand plan. He began by loving the people before him. He listened. He prayed. He served. Then he took the next faithful step. That is often how God works.

We sometimes imagine that God asks us to do extraordinary things. More often, He simply asks us to be faithful where we are. One conversation. One act of kindness. One family in need. One opportunity to encourage a brother Knight. One more moment spent with Jesus in prayer.

As members of a Council that gathers at our Carmelite Monastery, we are constantly reminded that every work of charity begins in prayer. Before our hands can serve, our hearts must first remain close to Jesus. Otherwise, even good works can become just another activity. But when they spring from a friendship with Jesus, they become a witness to His love.

This month, let us honor Blessed Michael McGivney not only by remembering him, but by imitating him. Let each of us ask Jesus:

"What is the next faithful step You are asking me to take?"

We may not change the whole world, but God has never asked us to do that. He asks us to be faithful today. And when ordinary men respond to His grace with generous hearts, He can accomplish far more through them than they could ever imagine.

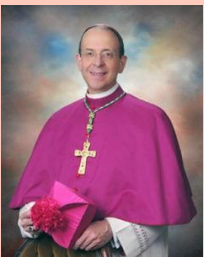
May Blessed Michael McGivney pray for each of us and for our Council, that together we may continue to be men of prayer, charity, and faithful service.

"Then Peter approaching asked him, 'Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive him? As many as seven times?' Jesus answered, 'I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times.'" (Gospel for Sept. 13, Mt 18:21-22)

To forgive others can be very difficult at times, especially when someone repeatedly offends us. Jesus tells us there is no magic number that limits our obligation — our desire to forgive and show mercy to others must be boundless, just as God's mercy toward us is infinite. We pray in the Our Father, "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us."

Our very salvation depends on our willingness to forgive, for God will forgive us in the measure that we forgive others (cf. Mt 6:14-15).).

This month, I challenge you to make a list of the people in your life — past and present — whom you find or have found difficult to forgive, and to sincerely pray for them each day

Questions for Reflection:

Are there people in your life whom you find difficult to forgive for past offenses? Do you sometimes find yourself saying the words "I forgive you," but holding on to the hurt like a grudge? What steps can you take to move to true forgiveness??

September Council Message for Agents

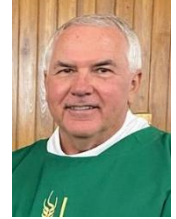

We are here to celebrate our work over the past year and to chart our path for the years ahead. For nearly a century and a half, we have upheld the vision of our founder, Blessed Michael McGivney. And to this day, we continue to advance in charity, unity, fraternity and patriotism — always in service to Christ and his Church.

This is a fitting time to reflect on our past, as well as our future. The United States — our original home — is commemorating its 250th anniversary. And Colorado is a fitting place to rededicate ourselves to the work ahead. We established our first council west of the Mississippi in this very city in 1900, and Denver Council 539 is still remembered as the "mother council of the West."

This city is also famously associated with St. John Paul II's bold call for a new evangelization at World Youth Day in 1993. Special Fourth Degree Exemplification (Port Orange, FL)

Grand Knights and Faithful Navigators of Volusia, Flagler and Seminole Counties

You are urged to invite eligible Knights in your respective councils to register for a special Fourth Degree Exemplification for the Florida District of the De Soto Province, set for Port Orange, FL on Saturday, August 29, 2026.

The ceremony will take place at Our Lady of Hope Catholic Church, Clyde Morris Blvd, Port Orange. Registration begins at 9:30 a.m., at the Father O'Leary Parish Center, followed by the ceremony at 11:00am.

Our Lady of Hope (Port Orange) Pastor Very Rev. Father Matthew Mello will be the Exemplification Honoree.

This will be the full Fourth Degree Exemplification ceremony that was first performed at St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York City on Washington's Birthday in February, 2022. The event will be open to Third Degree Knights in Volusia, Flagler and Seminole Counties (Districts 17-18-19-20-24). The cost for candidates is \$60.

In lieu of a banquet, host Council 8086 will offer a luncheon following the ceremony at the Parish Center (donations will be accepted, but Knights/guests should pre-register). Vigil Mass will be celebrated at the church at 4 p.m.

Council 8086 Grand Knight Vito Benedetto is handling arrangements for the lunch, which is not included in the candidate cost.

Unlike former years, family members and friends are encouraged to attend. Sir Knights who took the Fourth Degree prior to 2025 are also invited to experience the ceremony that stresses the importance of being a Patriotic Catholic Citizen.

Councils should begin by gathering the completed Form 4 membership application from their respective candidates along with the \$60 exemplification fee, and turning them over to their Financial Secretary. The FS will then prepare a roster, and write a council check payable to Robert Urrutia, Master. The FS is required to send in a downloaded copy of the registration form, signed Form 4 (all four copies for each candidate), and check payable to the Master, Robert Urrutia. Forms are available on the Corpus Christi Assembly 2810 website <https://assembly2810.org/forms/> or the Florida State Council website <https://www.floridakofc.org/Fourth-degree-Forms>. The package should be mailed to: John O'Malley, 4641 South Moon Trail, Port Orange, FL 32129, by August 19th. The registration form/roster should also be emailed to John O'Malley, Executive Assistant to the Master, at jjomalley99@outlook.com.

Please note the dress code for the exemplification. While tuxedos are no longer mandatory, candidates must wear a dark suit (not brown!) and black dress shoes.

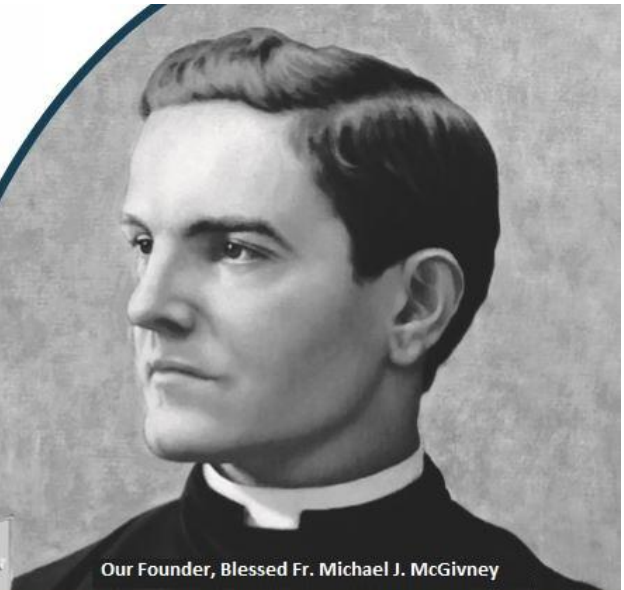
